Santa Fe/Taos Multi-sport Trip - May 12 - 19, 2007

Ellen Chilikas and John Campbell

Join us for 4 nights in Santa Fe and 3 nights in Taos. Both of our hotels are within walking distance of the town's respective Plazas.

- ✓ 3 days of road biking
- ✓ 50 miles around Santa Fe with 1000 feet of elevation gain,
- ✓ 30 - 40 miles in Los Alamos with about 1500 feet of elevation gain
- ✓ 60 miles near Taos with about 1200 feet of elevation gain;
- ✓ 1 day of either cycling a flat 30 miler or hiking in the Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument - 3 miles with 700 feet of elevation gain;
- ✓ 1 free day in Santa Fe to shop, gamble, visit wineries or visit Trader Joe's.
- ✓ In Taos you can go river rafting with us or cycling.
- ✓ Optional visits to Los Alamos and the Bradbury Science Museum, Anasazi cliff dwellings, the Ojo Caliente Mineral Springs and Spa, petroglyphs.
- ✓ Enjoy great shopping and galleries in both towns.

The cost of the trip is \$400 and includes the following: 7 nights double occupancy lodging, continental breakfast every morning, several coordinated training rides in the Denver area in April and May, a pre-trip pot luck 'meet and greet' party, 2 happy hours, 1 barbecue style dinner, a post trip party back in Denver, adult beverages and snacks at all get togethers, all

route maps, and the entrance fee to the National Park for those hiking. The cost does NOT include the rafting trip and meals not indicated.

This will be an Intermediate trip - riders are expected to be comfortable riding up to 60 miles on roads at a pace of ~12 mph and are self-sufficient. There will NOT be a sag vehicle. All trip participants will also be expected to perform one volunteer function such as set-up/clean-up for a happy hour, driving sweep for one of our routes, etc.

Summer 2006 Ride Accomplishments!

Congratulations are appropriate for some DBTC members. First, congrats to Nancy and Randy Fay on the first part of their pole to pole journey. Nancy and Randy started a self-supported bicycle ride on June 9th this past summer in Inuvik, NW Territory, Canada. Inuvik is above the Arctic Circle, almost near the Beaufort Sea. They pedaled 4,700 miles from there to San Diego, CA over the summer and fall. Their adventures can be monitored on the site www.hobobiker.com. Sometime next year they plan to continue to the polar circle of South America. That is only another 15,000 miles away!

Second, congrats to Russ Peterson on his completion of the Mt Everest Challenge in California this past September. On the first day, this ride covered 120 miles and 16,500 feet of elevation gain. On the second shorter day, the ride covered 85 miles and 13,000 feet of elevation gain. One of Russ's training rides last July was from his house in Lakewood to the top of Mt Evans and back!

received DBTC socks. We recognized the 30 members over the age of 75, up from six when we first started counting in 2002. Jim McClain, our out-of-town tour coordinator, previewed upcoming trips scheduled for 2007.

John Mues was the male ride leader of the year. He not only lead 14 rides this year, he was the Wednesday Fun Ride Coordinator and serves on the Board. Picket Wire Canyon Adventure

Oct 21-22

While the fall morning weather brought a cool but nice day start, the afternoon was changing to high strong winds and a chance of snow as I prepared to leave town. The almost featureless land along the road south of Limon seemed to be the fabled road to nowhere. A sign indicated "No Services next 86 Miles."

At the campground, a winter chill was definitely in the air. After returning from a warm restaurant for spicy burritos, we huddled around a warm campfire. Winter parkas were the evening bicycle wear "du jour." The snow overnight was minimal and temps only dropped to about 30 degrees.

We rode 20 miles to drop into a broadly incised canyon. Tall grasses were everywhere on the valley bottom. Horizontal lying rock formations rimmed the canyon top.

The stream flowed freely. Our adventure took us first to find some Native American petroglyphs etched on a fallen house sized sandstone boulder. In a crack aligned due south, a number of petroglyphs were inside. Speculation developed that this might be an ancient calendar site. Several petroglyphs were of lizards. Hand prints were seen as well.

We followed a trail along the river bottom to find where ranchers had constructed a number of rough stone dwellings over 100 years ago. Then we found a brontosaurus track way. For those who don't remember, these were some of the largest creatures to roam our planet about 200 million years ago. Their tracks are depressions the size of bushel baskets that are beside the flowing stream.

Further riding took us to an old ranching homestead in the canyon. This homestead was started in the late 1860's and operated until about 1970. At one time about 460 people resided in the canyon. What an unusual life these people must have had.

Sunday morning brought a clear blue sky for our 11 mile ride to Bent's Fort. Bent's Fort is an historic structure dating back to 1860 when the frontier was still wild. Native Americans, fur trappers, and buffalo competed for their respective existences. The National Park Service has restored this fort to an amazing museum-quality condition containing many antiques from the frontier era.

Stuart's Wild Wild West La Junta weekend offered a unique adventure for Colorado bicyclists. Anyone with an interest in history would find the weekend special. Thanks to Stuart Black for organizing this outing!
