SAFETY AND SECURITY WHEN RIDING by Steve Ingraham

All riders should pay close attention and spot **safety** hazards while riding ... cars running lights at intersections, erratic riders, car doors about to open, cracks in the pavement, wet bridges. But **security** should also be a concern, especially when riding alone: security for your bike - security for your equipment - and security for yourself.

Security for your bike involves locking your bike for times when you and your bike are separated. Security for your equipment means never leaving your backpack unattended.

Security for yourself is a concern when preparing for your ride and while riding.

Be aware of suspicious activity in the parking lot as you **prepare** for your ride. Just as importantly, be aware of groups of people or unsavory-appearing people **while riding** the trails and streets. There have been reports of assaults in broad daylight of riders on Denver's trails. If something looks suspicious, turn around if need be and take another route. Remember that you might have that flat tire. If you might feel uncomfortable breaking down in remote or unfamiliar areas, avoid these areas when riding alone ... explore new places with companions.

Remember, **safety** and **security** are both important in making your ride enjoyable.

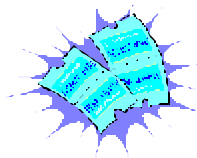

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY AND HOLIDAY WINTER RIDES

FUN/INT-2/3-20/30-NESW-11:00AM Unless there is a leader named, WINTER rides will be Show-N-Go. The riders who show up on these days will decide among themselves the route, the mileage, the pace and the after-ride restaurant. The starting locations will be places where many rides have begun in the past and thus several riders will have an idea of possible routes to be taken. You can go to www.dbtc.org and hit the start locations button for more detailed directions to most of the starting points.

Sat, Nov 3 **Lin's Birthday ride**

Parking: The morning group will meet Lin Hark (303 507-3502) at the City of Cuernavaca Park lot. Directions: exit I-25 at 23rd Ave., drive past REI and continue north on Platte St about 5 blocks (under the overpass) to the parking lot. The lunch and after noon groups should park here and then ride to REI to meet the rest of the group.

FUN/Leisure H1-24-Central morning riders will meet at 9:15 AM for a 9:30 AM start for the morning 24 miles. Slower riders can shorten their ride to arrive for lunch at REI by noon. Other riders who choose to do only the afternoon ride can come at 12 PM to join the group for lunch before riding the afternoon 35 miles (or turn around whenever you like). Bring layers of clothes, water, snacks, and a lock. No gifts, your presence will be Lin's gift. This ride will go regardless of the temperature or trail conditions but will be postponed if it is raining or snowing. Rain/snow date is November 10th, but it will be colder in the morning because of the time change.

12:00-12:45 PM Lunch at Starbuck's at REI hopefully out on the deck in the sunshine, but if the sun is not shining we can go inside Starbuck's to warm up. You can bring lunch or buy a sandwich at either Starbucks or the new Vitamin Cottage where Shakespeare's used to be.

FUN/Leisure H1-35-Central 12:45 PM Meet at REI Starbucks (park at City of Cuernavaca Park and ride to REI) to ride south on the Platte River Trail to Chatfield for a short break and return before dark or turn around whenever you like.

NOTE: Lin rides an average rate of 10-11 MPH but you can ride as fast or slow as you like, regroup with Lin or not, for this ride. The social part of the ride will be the LUNCH at REI.

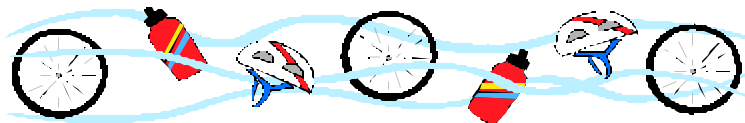
